PASTOR'S CORNER — FROM PASTOR RICK

I'm writing this column in the week between Christmas and the New Year. It's a popular time to once again make New Year's resolutions. Have you made your resolutions?

I looked back in time and here are some of the most popular resolutions: Spend more time with family; get in shape; lose weight; quit smoking and quit drinking; get out of debt; get organized; enjoy life more; learn something new; and help others.

Each of the items on this list project a longing to improve one's physical and mental well being as well as a longing for quality human relationships.

One could also translate the list into four categories for a more succinct resolution: I resolve to improve my mind, my heart, my strength and my soul.

That resolution reminds me of very old Jewish prayer — the Shema Yisrael. You can find in Deuteronomy 6:4-5. "Hear, O Israel, the Lord is our God, the Lord alone. You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul and with all your might."

The people are commanded to keep the words in the heart and to recite them to their children. Do it at home

when you lay down and when you rise. The people are to bind those words as a sign on their hands and an emblem on their foreheads.

If we make reciting the Shema our New Year's resolution. I wonder what effect that would have on our prayer lives, on our demeanors, and on our relationships with other people and our God.

Remember, it was Jesus who added love of neighbor to the Shema.

May your New Year be a happy and healthy one full of joy and peace. May you move closer to your God and closer to your fellow man as you love and when your are away. Do it God and serve your neighbor.
